

### PEACHSTATE CELEBRATES 56TH RENNFEST ANNIVERSARY IN NORTH GEORGIA

This three-day event featured a mix of Autocross, Rally, and Concours competitions. It was well-attended, from across the Southeast, including Florida, Alabama, South and North Carolina, and Tennessee. The festivities wrapped up on Sunday with an awards banquet, celebrating 56 years of continuous Rennfest weekends.

#### **RENNFEST AWARDS BANQUET**



The Peachstate Region PCA gathered once again over Labor Day weekend for their annual Rennfest celebration, this time marking the 56th anniversary of the beloved event. Set in the picturesque North Georgia mountains, the weekend's festivities took place in the charming town of Young Harris, providing an ideal backdrop filled with camaraderie, competition, and, of course, some light-hearted fun.

This year's Rennfest rally was a standout, with 34 teams eagerly signing up to navigate the winding mountain roads on Saturday afternoon. As always, the weather was a concern, but participants held out hope that the rain would hold off. The rally, one of the cornerstones of the Rennfest weekend, challenges both drivers and their navigators to communicate effectively while maintaining their average speeds (CAST) through the demanding terrain.



Friday night kicked off the rally preparations with an engaging rally school. Approximately 40 participants, including drivers and their navigators, attended the session. The rally school focused on teaching navigators how to communicate efficiently with their drivers—specifically by using hand signals to ensure clear and timely instructions as used by Sterling Moss and Denis Jenkinson in the 1955 Mille Miglia. It's an art form within itself and an essential skill for any competitive rally team.

On Saturday, the rally started promptly with the first car leaving the grid at 1:30 PM. From there, teams navigated through the stunning curvy roads that wind through the North Georgia mountains. Drivers reveled in the opportunity to fully enjoy their Porsches on the scenic routes, all while trying to maintain their correct average speeds (CAST).

Competition was as fierce as ever, with 20 teams competing in the SOP (Seat of the Pants) class and 9 teams battling it out in the Tour class. The curvy mountain roads added an extra layer of challenge to the rally, requiring precision, communication, and experience to master the turns and navigate through the stages effectively.

In Seat-of-Pants (SOP) class, top honors with a low score of 313 points went to Leroy Walden and Jeff Frye. This year Jeff teamed with a new driver, sorry Patty, in hopes of taking top spot and after missing the 2<sup>nd</sup> instruction on the ODO pulled through to take top honors. They were closely followed by Dennis and Deanna yates with an excellent score of 325 with Gary and Donna just behind them with 313 points for 3<sup>rd</sup> place.



In Tour class, the competition was equally as fierce with Jeff and Julie Moeller taking top honors with a score of 325 points. Our own concours chair David Bloom, along with Joshua Sachs, is really getting in the grove with just 350 points for second place followed by the Lewis Broyles / Susan Morgan coming in 3<sup>rd</sup> with 425 points.

However, the excitement didn't end with the rally. Rennfest's beloved DALBF Pink Pig Award, a playful and humorous tradition, had an extra twist this year. Longtime emcees Dick Kjellsen and Mark Shivez, known for adding laughter and energy to the event over the years, found the tables turned as they became the recipients of an honorary Pink Pig. Their surprise and the audience's delight made for an unforgettable moment, adding even more fun to the festivities.

With Dick's help, the PINK Pig award was finally presented to the rally team of Kenneth Raines and his granddaughter, Brynnleigh Larson, who earned an impressive 815 points. Remarkably, this marks Ken's third time winning the coveted award. In a nostalgic twist, Brynnleigh was also with him the first time he claimed the honor—back then, she cheered him on from a special baby seat, serving as his youngest navigator.

Maybe it's just knowing that over one hundred of our fellow Club Members and their guests will join to admire the painstakingly prepared Porsches? No matter the reason, a great time is always had by all.

Twenty-nine entrants competed in fourteen classes, treating all participants and guests to an array of Porsche treasures. Class 02-S featured three 914s, with what one might call the Goldilocks show.

The orange 914-6 of Joey Duran was a full race version of the mid-engined classic and was a stark contrast to the sleek silver 914 2.0 of automotive artist, Michael Ledwitz.

However, it was the Gulf race livery of Al Meredith's 914 that took the class win. On this Sunday, it was "just right."





Rarity reigned with the modern Widowmaker 996 GT2 of Jack Gilsdorf that featured a raceprepped powerplant. A Widowmaker, indeed.

Rounding out the Street Class were two throwbacks to the venerable 1980's: the Alpine white on Can-can red 944 turbo of Mitchel DeFrancis and the widebody turbo-look 911 Carrera of Russ Bryan, which was still pristine from its win on the national stage of the Parade Concours in Birmingham.

The Tour Class enjoyed a similar Deja-vu with the Grand Prix White 968 of Howard Kuo and the Guards Red 911 Carrera Cabriolet of Ron Rollins. Long live the 80's!





356 fans were wowed by the both of the open-top beauties on display. Jerry Smalley showed his rare 356 B Roadster, flanked by the Gmund Gold award-winning Aquamarine 356 Speedster of Ray Morgan. Beyond winning the prestigious Gmund award, the Morgan's Speedster earned another high mention at the Hennessy Concours – a perfect score of 235.0 points. Outstanding!








Early 911 lovers rejoiced with the trio of F-body cars on display. Thibault Corens returned from his maiden Concours at DOMA with his Irish Green 912. The youngster and his green machine were pipped this time by the veterans of Jack & Dotty Cooke and their Bahia Red 911S and the Bourdeaux Red 911 of Daryl Goetz, which earned the Class win.





The "last of the air-cooled" 911s featured both open and closed versions of the venerable 993. Sporting the wide-body of the turbo and the unique split-vaned rear spoiler, Vernon Faust's 993 C2S was menacing in its black livery. However, quietly tucked into the corner, David Nichol's Speed Yellow 993 Cabriolet shined in all of its glory, missing a perfect score by just one-tenth of a point.

The modern water-cooled 911s were a compliment of their own wide-body cars, with Ron Spinuzzi's black 997 turbo and Rod Slack's 996 C4S flanking the Cream White 997 Carrera S Cabriolet of Jim Contardi, which took top honors in the Class, beautiful body-painted hard-back sport seats and all.






Lovers of the newest generation 911s enjoyed the 2024 911T of Caleb Jones, resplendent in classic Guards Red. The hard-fought competition, however, was between the 991 Turbos. Kevin Ferguson's Golden Yellow Exclusive Series Turbo S tied in scoring with the Basalt 911 turbo S of Richard Maury, with the two cars each receiving a mere four-tenths point deductions. Parade Competition Rules dictate that tiebreakers be determined (first) by the Exterior Score the cars receive, yielding the win to Maury. We can't wait to enjoy seeing these cars highly prepared cars feature at another Peachstate Concours.







Four-door Porsches were well represented at the Concours. Alyson Laskowski returned for her second Concours and her Sapphire Blue Macan edged out the Chalk Cayenne of Dan DeRiemer.



Second-generation Boxster/Caymans in Class 13-T featured two special edition models. Ernie Cabrera brought his Carrera White Cayman R which contrasted with its open-top variant, the Black Boxster Spyder of Lewis Broyles. Lewis took the win this time, but these two cars have been head-to-head before, and no doubt we will see both at the next Concours.

I contacted the restaurant and let them know we had more coming than I had estimated, but that we usually had some last minute cancellations or no-shows and that we would probably have 55 to 60

We made a short rest stop in Rome before continuing to Little River Canyon State Park where we stopped to see the waterfall.

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


SIMPLY EURO






## Updated PCA History Book Online Now! Through the Ages now features the latest club events and programs


